I. CALL TO ORDER

President Tom Zipfel called the April 9, 2025 Workshop Meeting of the Hatfield Township Board of Commissioners to order at 7:00 pm.

4. Motion to provide a conditional offer of employment to Cynthia Sheehy as a patrol officer based on the eligibility list certified by the Hatfield Township Civil Service Commission, conditioned upon successful completion of a psychological and physical exam.

Commissioner Andris motioned to provide a conditional offer of employment to Cynthia Sheehy, seconded by Vice President Rodgers. The motion carried with a 5-0 vote.

5. <u>Pool Consortium - Chemical Bid Award</u> *Motion to award the pool consortium bid to Buckmans, Inc. for \$521,279.53*

Mr. Bibro said this was rebid because of a clerical error in the first bid. This bid is for all the communities that are part of the consortium and the bid is significantly less than last year.

Commissioner Andris motioned to award the Chemical Bid to Buckman's Inc., seconded by Commissioner LoStracco. The motion carried with a 5-0 vote.

6. Tax Appeal Settlement – 3035 Campus Drive *Motion for Approval*

Solicitor Iannozzi said this tax appeal results in an increase to the Township in the amount of \$1,953.

Commissioner Andris motioned to approve the Tax Settlement Appeal for 3035 Campus Drive, seconded by Vice President Rodgers. The motion carried with a 5-0 vote.
